

Comments on the 2016 SEC's Proposed Rule Changes for Reporting of Mineral Resources and Reserves

Abstract: In June of 2016, the SEC requested comments on their proposed rule changes for Reporting of Mineral Resources and Reserves in which the author chaired the Mining and Metallurgical Society of America's committee for review and response. This presentation will outline some of the major comments submitted to the SEC on their proposed changes. It will also note some of the potential impacts to our industry should the proposed rules be adopted as published.
